



REINSTATEMENT OF CERTIFICATION

Diplomates who have lost their certification due to medical license revocation or non-participation in the Continuing Certification program must adhere to the following steps in order to have their certification reinstated:

1. Verification of a full and unrestricted medical license in all states where practicing. The medical license must not have any restrictions.
2. If loss of certification is due to action taken by the state licensing board, the applicant may apply and be considered for the Maintenance of Certification Exam.
3. The Applicant must pass the Maintenance of Certification exam prior to re-entry.
4. The Applicant must pay all outstanding fees accrued during the time of certification.
5. Applicant must show evidence of meeting the MOC annual minimum number of CME required prior to re-entry.
6. All relevant information from the Diplomate is reviewed by Credentials & Ethics Committee.
7. Credentials & Ethics Committee recommends to the Board one of the following resolutions to the matter:
 - a. Admit Applicant into the Continuing Certification Program
 - b. Defer action pending review/reinstatement of medical license by state authority
 - c. Non-admittance
8. At the time of re-entry into certification an individual receives a 10-year time-limited certificate and is required to participate in all aspects of Continuing Certification.
